

【問題】以下の英文を日本語に訳せ。

Mitochondrial diseases are baffling genetic disorders. They range from mild to deadly, can occur early in life or late, and have no cures and few treatments. They are named for the tiny organelles, scattered throughout every cell of the body, that convert food into energy. These power plants
5 contain a small amount of DNA—distinct from the chromosomes in the egg’s nucleus—that is only passed on from mother to child. Once detected, mitochondrial diseases put parents in a bind. Indeed, Shaw worries that her 2-year-old son, Liam, will suffer. Although he looks fine now, she says, if she had known about her disease early, “I would have never had a baby.”
